No. 7632 } To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

Whereas, Joseph H Vanpetten of Decatur County Kansas

has deposited in the GENERAL LAND OFFICE of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Oberlin Kansas, whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said Joseph H Vanpetten

according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An Act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," and the acts supplemental thereto, for

the West half of the North East quarter of Section twenty five in Township one South of Range twenty six West of the Sixth Principal Meridian in Kansas containing eighty acres

according to the official plat of the survey of the said lands returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been purchased by the said Joseph H Vanpetten

Now know ye, That the United States of America, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress in such case made and provided, HAVE GIVEN AND GRANTED, and by these presents DO GIVE AND GRANT, unto the said Joseph H Vanpetten

and to his heirs, the said tract above described: To HAVE AND TO HOLD the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature, thereunto belonging, unto the said

Joseph H Vanpetten and to his heirs and assigns forever.

In testimony whereof, I Benjamin Harrison PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, have caused these letters to be made patent, and the seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.
