Ms. O'Neal as he followed her down a hallway.

Lindgren said he heard about five shots before Revell chased Ms. O'Neal into his bedroom.

"I had a gun poked right at me," he said. "He was muttering some remarks, no conversation.

"I whacked him with him up the head. I was afraid he was going to shoot me, so I didn't go any further than that. It knocked his cap off."

Stunned by the blow, Revell fell back against a stairway rail and warned Lindgren, "'Don't come any nearer," Lindgren recalled. But he added: "I got my lick in."

Revell then left the house and traveled, apparently on foot, to Grove Avenue. It was there that Lt. J. Richard Carmack, aided by a radio broadcast describing Revell, spotted him

on an Interstate 195 overpass.

Revell pointed a gun at the officer, Maj. A. Steve Csaky said.

Revell then fled down Grove and across Hamilton Street, Csaky said. As Carmack and Detective Steve Sorensen pursued him, Revell turned around and "pointed his gun at one of the policemen" on the other side of Hamilton, Csaky said.

Carmack then fired once at Revell, missing him, and "about the same time or shortly thereafter, the man shot himself in the head," Csaky said.

A gynecologist who witnessed the pursuit and stood by before ambulances arrived said he did not administer first aid since there was little he could have done to treat the wound.

The police internal affairs division is investigating the incidents, said Csaky, adding that the guns used by Carmack and Revell have been recovered.
