

WHITTAKER -John Sanders Whittaker was born near Bowling Green, Va., Oct. 26, 1827. Moved to Ohio in 1845 Married Angeletta Bosarth Jan. 11, 1855 Three children were born to this union, two dving in infancy. Came to Gardner, Kan., in 1857 and settled on the farm which had ever since been his home. His wife died May 10, 1860. He was again married Oct. 2, 1864, to Mrs. Sarah Goresline. Five children were born to them, three dving in infancy. Obeyed the gospel Jan. 6, 1894 He had a stroke of paralysis in 1900, and being very feeble nis faithful wife would never lose sight of him for long at a time. On the evening of Aug. 29, 1902, she found his lifeless form not far from the house. He was a member of the Carroll congregation and notwithstanding his feeble health he seldom missed a Lord's day meeting. Three brothers, his faithful wife, two sons, one daughter, two step daughters and five grand children survive him.
